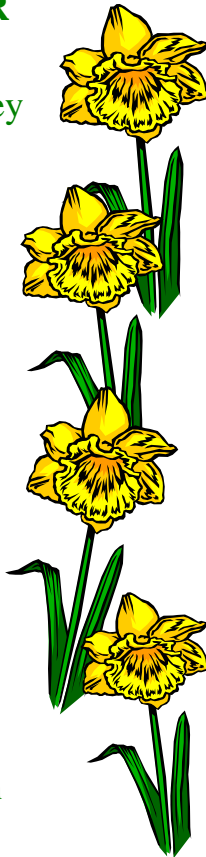

Don't miss the upcoming festival! It promises to be really spectacular, with another new conductor for the singing, a new event—Welsh Country Dancers with live music! Mr. Richard Phillips of Pella Iowa, formerly of Wales Richard came to Iowa as an exchange student at Central College, and stayed to marry his American sweetheart. He has "called" folk dancing in Wales, and we have him in this area to call dances for us! And there will be REAL Welsh dancers, from Colorado, Missouri and Minnesota, (so we won't have to dance unless we want to). These three dance groups have never danced together before. Some local Irish dancers may come too.

We will also have a live Welsh band. Well, half of it is Welsh—John Good from Phoenix, AZ. I know some of you have

John and Irish American friend, Steve Colby, play traditional Welsh music, and some modern stuff but NOT ROCK AND ROLL. They play an amazing variety of instruments, including a real Welsh bagpipe! And they are so much FUN!

Rev. Joe Corbin from Wisconsin will conduct the Gymanfa Ganu, and also will be one of our *three* soloists, the others being Gwenith Closs Colgrove, who is well known and loved by the Nebraska St. David's Society people, and Richard Phillips, our dance caller, is also a soloist!

The Welsh theater will be showing films whenever the auditorium is not otherwise occupied. We have some new ones, including a sheep dog demonstration that is truly remarkable. The Bethel Church organ will get a good workout as well, with lots of singing.

The Gift Shop will be well stocked with goodies from Wales. We are planning to have some seminars, and the Cemetery will be peopled by some familiar and some new spirits this year. A Welsh lesson will take us to the little Welsh schoolhouse. You can do research in *Y Drych*, so bring your ancestors' death dates and places and you can look them up. I learned a lot more about my great grandfather than was in the local paper. Like where he was from! Banquets will be held Saturday and Sunday evening.

Welshman to Lead Des Moines Science Center

Des Moines Register, May 6, 2009

The Science Center of Iowa found its new leader in Scotland. Officials on Tuesday announced that Paul Jennings of Dundee, Scotland, will replace Mary Sellers, who resigned in April after nine years.

Jennings, 38, was chief executive of the Dundee Sensation Science Center in Scotland for the past eight years.

Jennings said the Science Center of Iowa has the potential to become a national and international leader in the field. The Newport, South Wales, native said he will work to strengthen collaborations with academic institutions, industry, business and community groups.

"The gauge of a good science center is how you integrate into the community," he said. In addition to his duties in Dundee, Jennings was asked by the Scottish government in 2007 to lead another science center in Aberdeen, Scotland. He helped establish Europe's National Science Network.

One of the biggest challenges the Science Center of Iowa and similar organizations face is the global economic slowdown, Jennings said. "The Science Center of Iowa is well-positioned to emerge from this downturn in a very strong position," he said. His arrival in Des Moines comes as Science Center officials prepare this weekend to kick off the summer lineup of events, exhibits and IMAX Dome Theater features. "No two days will be the same," Jennings said.

From Iowa drive to Lincoln Nebraska on Interstate 80. Pick up US Highway 77 on the west side of Lincoln

Wymore is 53 miles south of Lincoln on US Highway 77.

Beatrice is where the motel, NEW Victorian Inn is located and is 45 miles south of Lincoln on US Highway 77. The motel is north of Beatrice, just south of the Holiday Inn Express.

Continue south to Wymore on US 77. Turn left on D Street and go to 7th Street, where you turn left again. Go 3/4 block north to the Welsh Heritage Centre.
